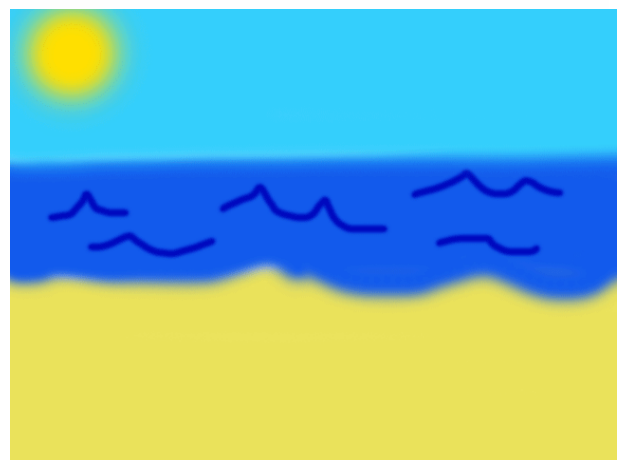
Gone, Baby, Gone and other thrillers by Dennis Lehane
